Message


After determining your audience, you will want to solidify your message. What is the one thing you want to communicate to your audience through your design?



Although sort of cringey, I do think there is a special meaning in that even though it feels very far, you really aren't that separated. So, that is why the moon is there because they are seeing the "same one."
